Complaints and Praise

We are always seeking feedback from our patients and looking for ways to improve our service.

Many of you will be aware of the Friends and Family Test we are running. This test asks one simple question, "Would you recommend this Surgery to your friends or family". So far we are pleased to report 99% of the responses we have received would either be "Extremely Likely" or "Likely" to recommend our surgery.

Changes to the waiting room - Update

From last month: We have been reporting in our previous two issues on our plans to improve the waiting area.

Currently we are considering two options:

- 1) Convert the children's waiting area into an admin room for the Practice Manger, Deputy Practice Manager and Accounts Clerk.
- 2) Convert the main waiting room into an office by inserting a new wall. This option would also improve the confidentiality issues we have at present regarding the serving window.

Either plan would create a much needed extra consulting room and additional storage space for medical notes.

We are in the process of obtaining quotes for the work, so far the quote for the IT and extra telephone portals were better than expected as it would appear our current system has capacity for the additional outlets. It has been estimated that it will take two engineers one day to complete the IT work and would cause little or no interference to the running of the surgery.

We are still waiting for building quotes which we hope to receive this week and will update you in the next issue with regard to the final decision.



Patient Participation Group

The Patient Participation Group is open to all fully registered patients of the practice staff.

At present Dr. Whooley and Karen Greaves the Practice Manager are the Surgery representatives and attend all the meetings.

The current group meets on a monthly basis and the meetings are held in an informal way here at the Surgery.

At present the group is working on the patient satisfaction questionnaire for 2015, which is being led by Deborah Bland.

When we met on the 29th July, we had only received 25 completed questionnaires. It was agreed that although the replies were very good, we needed to run the survey for at least another month to get a reasonable sample.

We are extremely grateful to Debbie for leading this project and to all those who have taken the trouble to complete a questionnaire – Thank You.

The PPG will be running a cake stall to raise funds for the additional medical equipment the surgery will need after the refit.

The stall will be held in the Surgery on the 21th September from 10:00a.m - 12 Noon. All are welcome.

To assist patients we do have a dedicated cancellation answer machine service available 24 hours a day.

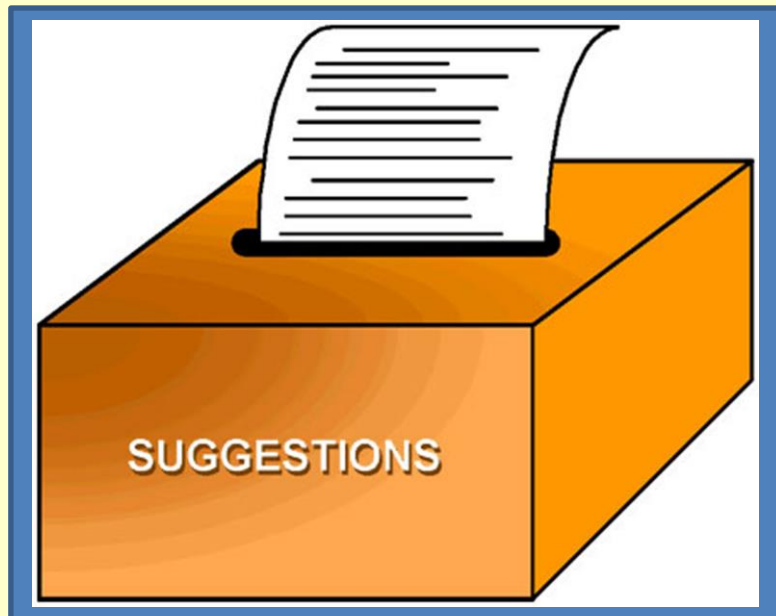
Please remember it is highly likely we can re-book your slot even at very short notice.
